


MAA | Multi-Actor Approach

Definition & requirements: introduction to the Work Programmes, e.g., Horizon Europe Cluster 6 WP23-24 p. 21-23:



- 7 key requirements

Eligibility criteria!





JRC | Joint Research Centre

- ✓ JRC cannot participate in drafting the project proposal
- Applicants should consider the JRC's potential contribution based on the topic text
- After proposal selection, discussions will define JRC's participation terms
- ✓ If agreed, the JRC may join the grant agreement as a beneficiary or an associated partner (requesting zero funding)

Knowledge Centres



Applicants are encouraged to consider, where relevant, their possible contribution to Joint Research Centre (JRC) relevant platforms for capitalizing on the knowledge developed in their projects, and becoming more policy relevant, contributing in terms of data, indicators and knowledge ²⁸. For instance, they could make reference to: the European Platform on Life Cycle Assessment (LCA) and to the Environmental footprint method when applying LCA; the Raw Materials Information System; the European Soil Observatory; the Integrated Natural

Capital Accounting platform: the EC Knowledge Centre for Biodiversity; the EC Knowledge Centre for Global Food and Nutrition Security, the EC Knowledge Centre for Bioeconomy, the Africa Knowledge Platform; the EC Knowledge Centre on Earth Observation; Innovation in the Built Environment (iBUILT+) and/or the EU Forests Observatory.

JRC funds its activities in collaborative projects with consortia from its own budget



International Cooperation

CL6 is normally the cluster with the most topics explicitly marked for international participation (42% of topics in 2025). However, participation does not mean that international partners are also eligible for funding.



List of Participating Countries

International Cooperation: Co-funding mechanism (CFM)

- Flagging of call topics specifically relevant for international cooperation in the work programmes, e.g. in
 - · Strategic thematic areas (topics)
 - · Geographical areas (countries/region's)
 - Multilateral initiatives
 - · Collaboration with key partners

In the 2025 WP, depending on the topic, encouragement to collaborate with:

- CN (under the EU-CN FAB flagship initiative); US, JP, KR, IN (Biotech & Manufaturing Initiative);
- LA & Caribbean countries;
- BR;
- Africa/target actions





Open topics



A novelty that comes straight from the TOP

What does this mean?

- Applicants have more flexibility to define their own research questions or approaches.
- They must align with the overall objectives and expected impacts of the call.
- AIM: be disruptive / innovative / use that research you haven't seen in topics thus far
- IA in F2F (TRL 6-7) & CIRCBIO (TRL 6-8); two-stage evaluation

Example of what not to do:

- Don't resubmit proposals from previous topics this isn't the aim
- Take care your proposal isn't covered by other topics



Two-Stage & Blind Evaluation



Part A

- No need to hide information!
- The IT system will automatically hide consortium details from evaluators.

Part B

- It is up to the applicant to hide personal information in the firststage application.
- · If any information is found, the proposal is inadmissible.
- · Evaluated on a case-by-case basis.
- Mention of country of the applicant does not necessarily mean that a proposal will be deemed inadmissible
- Blacked out names and information are not preferred but accepted.




Tips

- Applicants cannot mention publications as theirs, but they can mention them from a neutral point of view.
- The consortium structure cannot be mentioned in the first stage application
- You can mention country of demonstration pilots / type of farms / climate regions

Example of what not to do:

- we will follow the methodology described by project partner (Dalin et.al.)"
- The consortium includes the larges producer in Spain
- Most consortium members were involved in project Horizontest2020
